### GPCD receives grant

Thanks to a \$70,000 Daniels Fund grant, Colorado Springs' Community Partnership for Child Development can continue offering a family engagement program for parents of at-risk children in El Paso County. With support from family advocates, parents can pursue a Child Development Associate Credential as part of the two-generation program, which helps parents improve education and gain better employment.

GPCD serves more than 2,000 children and families in El Paso County, but is only able to serve one in five of those in need.

### Penrose earns accolades

Penrose-St. Francis Health Services received the 2016 Distinguished Hospital

Award for Clinical Excellence from Healthgrades.
